About 12 preschoolers will start Year 1 in October, well up on literacy and numeracy skills, thanks to dedicated staff.

Another Cambodian school year ended in July and we are thrilled with the children's results with 98% passing their exams progressing to the next year. It is also encouraging to note that the number of poorly performing students decreased and the those achieving excellent marks increased, thanks to the hard work of our teachers and volunteers.

#### Water Filters

When 2 large water filters were installed at SC, staff realised that many SC children's families did not have water filters at home, so 69 family-size water filters were bought and presented to all SC children's families. They were encouraged to contribute \$3 (out of \$11). One mum says, "It is easier, faster, and more economical to have this water fil-



ter. I don't need to spend a long time to boil water that uses more wood or charcoal. Now I have enough clean water for my family."

# Savings Schemes

Developing good savings habits is a crucial step in breaking the poverty cycle. 35 kids from year 1 to high school save from their pocket money, currently averaging \$1.75

each. They save for bikes (50% subsidised by SC), shoes, clothes and special events. Sometimes they even give money to their parents to buy rice.

Parents are encouraged to save too and now 2 families have joined formal microfinance schemes.

Classes in Word, Excel and Khmer typing are taught to years 3-6. Secondary and High School students have finished all basic computer literacy, including Photoshop and Multi Media.
